Wine Tasting In Cyprus



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The island's longstanding tradition of winemaking needs no further proof than its claim to the world's oldest named wine still in production - that of Coummandaria. And whilst the same ancient grape varieties are still cultivated and the same villages produce wine in the old, traditional ways, the island's wine industry has also vastly modernized, progressed and expanded. From the high, sun-kissed southern slopes of the Troodos mountain range, to a stunning stretch between Limassol and Paphos and the rural areas of Larnaca and Nicosia.



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Along the way, you will be welcomed warmly at quaint villages and wineries, where you can sample choice vintages, learn from the locals, visit a wine museum or traditional and modern wineries. After all, the art of wine in Cyprus is more than simply a way of life; it is an inherent passion with roots that go even deeper than those of its vines. One of the most picturesque villages of Cyprus, Omodos village, is surrounded by vineyards, famous for its old wine press.

Visit the wine festival of Limassol (Lemesos) which is held yearly for two weeks from the end of August till the beginning of September.
